#### **Before You Begin**

- 1 Save and close all open files and exit all open applications.
- 2 Shut down your computer.
  - Windows 8.1: On the **Start** screen, click or tap the power icon  $\mathbf{0} \rightarrow$ Shut down
  - Windows 7: Click or tap Start → Shut down.



NOTE: If you are using a different operating system, see the documentation of your operating system for shut-down instructions.

- 3 Disconnect your computer and all attached devices from their electrical outlets.
- 4 Disconnect all cables such as telephone cables, network cables and so on, from your computer.
- 5 Disconnect all attached devices and peripherals, such as keyboard, mouse, monitor, and so on, from your computer.
- 6 Remove any media card and optical disc from your computer, if applicable.

#### Safety Instructions

Use the following safety guidelines to protect your computer from potential damage and ensure your personal safety.

WARNING: Disconnect all power sources before opening the computer cover or panels. After you finish working inside the computer, replace all covers, panels, and screws before connecting to the power source.



CAUTION: To avoid damaging the computer, make sure that the work surface is flat and clean.



CAUTION: To avoid damaging the components and cards, handle them by their edges and avoid touching pins and contacts.



CAUTION: Only a certified service technician is authorized to remove the computer cover and access any of the components inside the computer. See the safety instructions for complete information about safety precautions, working inside your computer, and protecting against electrostatic discharge.



CAUTION: Before touching anything inside your computer, ground yourself by touching an unpainted metal surface, such as the metal at the back of the computer. While you work, periodically touch an unpainted metal surface to dissipate static electricity, which could harm internal components.



CAUTION: When you disconnect a cable, pull on its connector or on its pull-tab, not on the cable itself. Some cables have connectors with locking tabs or thumb-screws that you must disengage before disconnecting the cable. When disconnecting cables, keep them evenly aligned to avoid bending any connector pins. When connecting cables, make sure that the ports and connectors are correctly oriented and aligned.



CAUTION: To disconnect a network cable, first unplug the cable from your computer and then unplug the cable from the network device.



CAUTION: Press and eject any installed card from the media-card reader

## After Working Inside Your Computer

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CAUTION: Leaving stray or loose screws inside your computer may severely damage your computer.

- 1 Replace all screws and make sure that no stray screws remain inside your computer.
- 2 Connect any external devices, peripherals, and cables you removed before working on your computer.
- 3 Replace any media cards, discs, and any other part(s) that you removed before working on your computer.
- 4 Connect your computer and all attached devices to their electrical outlets.
- 5 Turn on your computer.

### **Removing the Battery**

- 1 Close the display and turn the computer over.
- 2 Slide the battery-release latches to the unlock position.
- **3** Using your fingertips, lift the battery at an angle and remove the battery off the battery bay.

- **4** Turn the computer over and open the display as far as possible.
- 5 Press and hold the power button for 5 seconds after the computer is unplugged to ground the system board.

## Replacing the Battery



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- 1 Slide the tabs on the battery into the slots on the battery bay and snap the battery into place.
  - **NOTE:** Make sure the battery-release latches are secured.
- 2 Turn the computer over and open the display as far as possible.

- Slide the optical-drive filler into the optical-drive filler bay and align the screw hole on the optical-drive filler with the screw hole on computer base.

## Removing the Memory Module

- 1 Using your fingertips, pry apart the securing clips on each end of the memory-module slot until the memory module pops up.
- 2 Slide and remove the memory module from the memory-module slot.

## Replacing the Memory Module



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#### **Procedure**

- Align the notch on the memory module with the tab on the memory-1 module slot.
- 2 Slide the memory module into the slot at an angle and press the memory module down until it clicks into place.

NOTE: If you do not hear the click, remove the memory module and reinstall it.


CAUTION: To avoid data loss, do not remove the hard drive while the computer is in Sleep or On state.

#### **Prerequisites**

- **1** Remove the battery.
- 2 Remove the base cover.

- 1 Remove the screws that secure the hard-drive assembly to the computer base.
- 2 Slide the hard-drive assembly away from the system-board connector to disconnect the hard-drive assembly from the system board.

Using the pull tab, lift the hard-drive assembly at an angle and remove it from the computer base.

## Replacing the Hard Drive



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CAUTION: Hard drives are fragile. Exercise care when handling the hard drive.

#### **Procedure**

- 1 Align the screw holes on the hard-drive bracket with the screw holes on the hard drive.
- 2 Replace the screws that secure the hard-drive bracket to the hard drive.
- 3 Slide the hard-drive assembly into the slot on the computer base and place the hard-drive assembly on the computer base.
- 4 Using the pull tab, slide the hard-drive assembly towards the systemboard connector to connect the hard-drive assembly to the system board.
- 5 Replace the screws that secure the hard-drive assembly to the computer base.

## Replacing the Keyboard



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#### **Procedure**

- Slide the keyboard cable into the system-board connector and press down on the connector latch to secure the cable.
- 2 Carefully turn the keyboard over, slide the tabs on the keyboard into the slots on the palm rest, and snap the keyboard into place.
- **3** Close the display and turn the computer over.



## Replacing the Wireless Card



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#### **Procedure**

- Align the notch on the wireless card with the tab on the wireless-card slot.
- 2 Insert the wireless card at an angle into the slot.
- **3** Press the other end of the wireless card down and replace the screw that secures the wireless card to the computer base.
- 4 Connect the antenna cables to the wireless card.
  The following table provides the antenna cable color schemes for the wireless card supported by your computer.

Connectors on the wireless card	Antenna-cable color
Main (white triangle)	White
Auxiliary (black triangle)	Black







# Replacing the System Board

- 2 Turn the system-board over.
- 3 Slide the system-board ports into the slots on the computer base.
- 4 Align the screw hole on the system board with the screw hole on the computer base.
  - CAUTION: Make sure that no cables are placed under the system board.
- **5** Replace the screw that secures the system board to the computer base.
- **6** Connect the display cable, power-adapter port cable, and speaker cable to the system board.
- 7 Adhere the tape to the display cable.

## **Entering the Service Tag in the BIOS**

- 3 Navigate to the **Main** tab and enter the Service Tag in the **Service Tag Input** field.

# Removing the Heat-Sink Assembly

CAUTION: To ensure maximum cooling for the processor, do not touch the heat transfer areas on the heat sink. The oils in your skin can reduce the heat transfer capability of the thermal grease.



# Replacing the Heat-Sink Assembly

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CAUTION: Incorrect alignment of the heat sink can cause damage to the system board and processor.

#### **Procedure**

- 1 Clean the thermal grease from the bottom of the heat-sink assembly and reapply it.
- 2 Align the screw holes on the heat-sink assembly with the screw holes on the system board.
- 3 In sequential order (indicated on the heat-sink assembly), replace the screws that secure the heat-sink assembly to the system board.
- 4 Connect the fan cable to the system board.

- 1 Follow the procedure from step 2 to step 7 in "Replacing the <u>System Board</u>".
- 2 Replace the palm rest.
- **3** Replace the <u>wireless card</u>.
- 4 Replace the <u>keyboard</u>.
- **5** Follow the procedure from step 3 to step 5 in "Replacing the <u>Hard Drive</u>".
- **6** Replace the <u>base cover</u>.
- **7** Replace the <u>battery</u>.

# Removing the Coin-Cell Battery

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
CAUTION: Removing the coin-cell battery resets the BIOS settings to default. It is recommended that you note the BIOS settings before removing the coin-cell battery.

- **3** Follow the procedure from step 1 to step 3 in "Removing the Hard Drive".

Using a plastic scribe, gently pry out the coin-cell battery out of the battery socket on the system board.











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

## Flashing the BIOS

You may need to flash (update) the BIOS when an update is available or when you replace the system board. To flash the BIOS:

- 1 Turn on the computer.
- 2 Go to dell.com/support.
- 3 If you have your computer's Service Tag, type your computer's Service Tag and click **Submit**.

If you do not have your computer's Service Tag, click **Detect My Product** to allow automatic detection of the Service Tag.
