#### Before you begin

- 1 Save and close all open files and exit all open applications.
- 2 Shut down your computer. Click **Start**  $\rightarrow$  **\textcircled{0} Power**  $\rightarrow$  **Shut down**.
  - NOTE: If you are using a different operating system, see the documentation of your operating system for shut-down instructions.
- **3** Disconnect your computer and all attached devices from their electrical outlets.
- **4** Disconnect all attached network devices and peripherals, such as keyboard, mouse, and monitor from your computer.
- **5** Remove any media card and optical disc from your computer, if applicable.
- 6 Close the display and turn the computer over.

### Safety instructions

- 3 Using your fingertips, lift the battery at an angle and remove the battery off the computer base.




Figure 1. Removing the battery




Figure 2. Removing the optical-drive assembly




Figure 3. Removing the optical-drive bracket




Figure 4. Removing the base cover




Figure 5. Removing the memory module








Figure 6. Removing the hard-drive assembly




Figure 8. Removing the hard-drive bracket




Figure 9. Removing the wireless card




Figure 12. Removing the keyboard cable and backlight cable




Figure 13. Folding the keyboard cables




Figure 14. Folding the keyboard cables

2 alignment line






Figure 15. Folding the keyboard cables




Figure 17. Removing the screws and disconnecting the speaker cable




Figure 19. Removing the optical-drive interposer





Figure 20. Removing the computer base




Figure 21. Removing the optical-drive interposer




Figure 22. Removing the speakers




Figure 23. Removing the I/O board





Figure 25. Removing the power-button board cable






Figure 26. Removing the power-button board and touchpad cables from the system board  $% \left( 1\right) =\left( 1\right) +\left( 1\right$




Figure 28. Turning the system board over




Figure 29. Removing the I/O-board and power-adapter port cables from the system board  $\,$




Figure 31. Removing the display assembly





Figure 33. Removing the display-panel screws




Figure 36. Removing the display back-cover and antenna assembly




Figure 37. Removing the camera




Figure 38. Removing the power-adapter port

# Flashing the BIOS

You may need to flash (update) the BIOS when an update is available or when you replace the system board. To flash the BIOS:

- 1 Turn on your computer.
- 2 Go to www.dell.com/support.

# Diagnostics

**Power and battery-status light/hard-drive activity light:** Indicates the battery-charge status or the hard-drive activity.



NOTE: Press Fn+H to toggle this light between power and battery-status light and hard-drive activity light.

#### Hard-drive activity light

Turns on when the computer reads from or writes to the hard drive.

#### Power and battery-status light

Indicates the power and battery-charge status.

**Solid white** – Power adapter is connected and the battery has more than 5 percent charge.

**Amber** – Computer is running on battery and the battery has less than 5 percent charge.

#### Off

- · Power adapter is connected and the battery is fully charged.
- · Computer is running on battery and the battery has more than 5 percent charge.
- · Computer is in sleep state, hibernation, or turned off.

The power and battery-status light blinks amber along with beep codes indicating failures.

For example, the power and battery-status light blinks amber two times followed by a pause, and then blinks white three times followed by a pause. This 2,3 pattern continues until the computer is turned off indicating no memory or RAM is detected.

The following table shows different light patterns and what they indicate.

Table 3. LED light codes

Light Pattern	Problem description
2,1	CPU failure
2,2	System board: BIOS and ROM failure
2,3	No memory or RAM detected
2,4	Memory or RAM failure



Light Pattern	Problem description
2,5	Invalid memory installed
2,6	System board or chipset error
2,7	LCD failure
3,1	CMOS battery failure
3,2	PCI/video card failure
3,3	Recovery image not found
3,4	Recovery image found but invalid

The computer may emit a series of beeps during start-up if the errors or problems cannot be displayed. The repetitive beep codes help the user troubleshoot problems with the computer.

Camera status light: Indicates whether the camera is in use.

- · Solid white Camera is in use.
- Off Camera is not in use.

Caps Lock status light: Indicates whether Caps Lock is enabled or disabled.

- · Solid white Caps Lock enabled.
- · Off Caps Lock disabled.
