- 2 Shut down your computer. Click Start > **U** Power > Shut down.

INOTE: If you are using a different operating system, see the documentation of your operating system for shut-down instructions.

- 3 Disconnect your computer and all attached devices from their electrical outlets.
- 4 Disconnect all attached network devices and peripherals, such as keyboard, mouse, and monitor from your computer.
- 5 Remove any media card and optical disc from your computer, if applicable.
- 6 After the computer is unplugged, press and hold the power button for 5 seconds to ground the system board.



- 2 Remove the two screws (#6-32xL6.35) that secure the computer cover to the chassis.
- 3 Slide the computer cover towards the back of the computer and lift the cover off the chassis.

- 4 Remove the four screws (M3xL3.5) that secure the top hard drive to the hard-drive bracket.
- 5 Lift the top hard drive off the hard-drive bracket.

(i) NOTE: Note the orientation of the hard drive so that you can replace it correctly.



- 6 Remove the four screws (M3xL3.5) that secure the bottom hard drive to the hard-drive bracket.
- 7 Slide the bottom hard drive out of the hard-drive bracket.



- 11 Gently pull and disconnect the optical-drive bezel form the optical drive.

- 1 Ensure that the release lever on the processor socket is fully extended in the open position. Then align the notches on the processor with the tabs on the processor socket and place the processor in the processor socket.
 - CAUTION: The pin-1 corner of the processor has a triangle that aligns with the triangle on the pin-1 corner on the processor socket. When the processor is properly seated, all four corners are aligned at the same height. If one or more corners of the processor are higher than the others, the processor is not seated properly.

Δ CAUTION: Ensure that the processor-cover notch is positioned underneath the alignment post.

- 2 When the processor is fully seated in the socket, close the processor cover.
- 3 Pivot the release-lever down and place it under the tab on the processor cover.



Boot Sequence allows you to bypass the System Setup–defined boot device order and boot directly to a specific device (for example: optical drive or hard drive). During the Power-on Self Test (POST), when the Dell logo appears, you can:





- (i) NOTE: Some tests for specific devices require user interaction. Always ensure that you are present at the computer terminal when the diagnostic tests are performed.

Running the ePSA diagnostics

- 1 Power-on the computer.
- 2 As the computer boots, press the F12 key as the Dell logo appears.
- 3 On the boot menu screen, select the **Diagnostics** option.
- 4 Click the arrow key at the bottom left corner. Diagnostics front page is displayed.
- 5 Press the arrow in the lower-right corner to go to the page listing.
- The items detected are listed.
- 6 To run a diagnostic test on a specific device, press Esc and click **Yes** to stop the diagnostic test.
- 7 Select the device from the left pane and click **Run Tests**.
- 8 If there are any issues, error codes are displayed.

Diagnostics

The computer POST (Power On Self Test) ensures that it meets the basic computer requirements and the hardware is working appropriately before the boot process begins. If the computer passes the POST, the computer continues to start in a normal mode. However, if the computer fails the POST, the computer emits a series of LED codes during the start-up. The system LED is integrated on the Power button.

The following table shows different light patterns and what they indicate.

Table 9. Diagnostics

Number of LED flashes	Problem description
2 amber, 1 amber	Motherboard failure
2 amber, 2 amber	Motherboard, PSU or PSU cabling failure
2 amber, 3 amber	Motherboard, RAM or CPU failure

CMOS battery failure

Flea power release

Flea power is the residual static electricity that remains on the computer even after it has been powered off and the battery has been removed. The following procedure provides the instructions on how to conduct flea power release:

- 1 Turn off your computer.
- 2 Disconnect the power adapter from your computer.
- 3 Press and hold the power button for 15 seconds to drain the flea power.
- 4 Connect the power adapter to your computer.
- 5 Turn on your computer.

Wi-Fi power cycle

If your computer is unable to access the internet due to Wi-Fi connectivity issues a Wi-Fi power cycle procedure may be performed. The following procedure provides the instructions on how to conduct a Wi-Fi power cycle:

() NOTE: Some ISPs (Internet Service Providers) provide a modem/router combo device.

- 1 Turn off your computer.
- 2 Turn off the modem.
- 3 Turn off the wireless router.
- 4 Wait for 30 seconds.
- 5 Turn on the wireless router.
- 6 Turn on the modem.
- 7 Turn on your computer.
