- **4** Disconnect all attached network devices and peripherals, such as keyboard, mouse, and monitor from your computer.
- **5** Remove any media card and optical disc from your computer, if applicable.
- **6** After the computer is unplugged, press and hold the power button for 5 seconds to ground the system board.




Removing the stand



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Procedure

- 1 Using a plastic scribe, pry the stand cover off the back cover.
- 2 Slide and remove the stand cover from the back cover.



Remove the four screws (M4x6) that secure the stand to the back cover.

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Procedure

- 1 Align the screw holes on the stand bracket with the screw holes on the back cover.
- 2 Replace the four screws (M4x6) that secure the stand bracket to the back cover.
- **3** Slide and replace the stand cover on the stand bracket.





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Procedure

- 2 Replace the screw (M2x2.5) that secures the optical-drive bracket to the optical drive.
- **3** Align the tabs on the optical-drive bezel with the slots on the optical-drive assembly and snap it into place.
- 4 Slide the optical-drive assembly into the optical-drive bay and align the screw hole on the optical-drive bracket with the screw hole on the middle-frame base.
- **5** Replace the screw (M3x5) that secures the optical-drive assembly to the middle-frame base.
- **6** Connect the optical-drive cable to the optical-drive assembly.

Removing the hard drive



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CAUTION: Hard drives are fragile. Exercise care when handling the hard drive.



CAUTION: To avoid data loss, do not remove the hard drive while the computer is in sleep or on state.



- 1 Place the hard drive into the hard-drive bracket and align the screw holes on the hard drive with the screw holes on the hard-drive bracket.
- 2 Replace the three screws (M3x3.5) that secure the hard-drive bracket to the hard drive.
- 3 Slide the hard-drive assembly into the hard-drive bay and align the screw hole on the hard-drive bracket with the screw hole on the middle-frame base.
- 4 Replace the screw (M3x5) that secures the hard-drive assembly to the middle-frame base.
- **5** Connect the hard-drive cable to the hard drive.

Removing the memory modules



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Prerequisites





- **3** Disconnect the antenna cables from the wireless card.

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Procedure



Removing the heat sink



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WARNING: The heat sink may become hot during normal operation. Allow sufficient time for the heat sink to cool before you touch it.



CAUTION: For maximum cooling of the processor, do not touch the heat transfer areas on the heat sink. The oils in your skin can reduce the heat transfer capability of the thermal grease.

Prerequisites

- 1 Remove the <u>stand</u>.
- 2 Remove the back cover.

Procedure




NOTE: Depending on the configuration you ordered, the number of screws and the appearance of the heat-sink assembly may differ.

- 1 In sequential order (as indicated on the heat sink), loosen the captive screws that secure the heat sink to the system board.
- 2 Remove the screw (M3x5) that secures the heat sink to the middle-frame base.

Replacing the heat sink



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CAUTION: Incorrect alignment of the heat sink can damage the system board and processor.



NOTE: The original thermal grease can be reused if the original processor and heat sink are reinstalled together. If either the processor or the heat sink is replaced, use the thermal pad provided in the kit to ensure that thermal conductivity is achieved.

Procedure

- 1 Align the captive screws on the heat sink with the screw holes on the system board.
- 2 In sequential order (as indicated on the heat sink), tighten the captive screws that secure the heat sink to the system board.
- **3** Replace the screw (M3x5) that secures the heat sink to the middle-frame base.

- Replace the back cover.
- 2 Replace the stand.



Removing the fan



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Prerequisites



- 1 Disconnect the fan cable from the system board.
- 2 Remove the two screws (M3x5) that secure the fan to the middle-frame base.

Removing the coin-cell battery



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CAUTION: Removing the coin-cell battery resets the BIOS setup program's settings to default. It is recommended that you note the BIOS setup program's settings before removing the coin-cell battery.

Prerequisites

- 1 Remove the stand.
- 2 Remove the back cover.

Procedure

Using a plastic scribe, gently push the tabs on the coin-cell battery and lift the coincell battery off its slot on the system board.

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Procedure

With the positive-side facing up, slide the coin-cell battery into the battery socket and snap the battery in place.

Removing the processor



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Prerequisites

- **3** Remove the <u>heat sink</u>.




NOTE: To avoid damaging the processor, handle the processor only by the edges.

Replacing the processor



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CAUTION: If either the processor or the heat sink is replaced, use the thermal grease provided in the kit to ensure that thermal conductivity is achieved.



NOTE: A new processor ships with a thermal pad in the package. In some cases, the processor may ship with the thermal pad attached to it.

Procedure



NOTE: The original thermal grease can be reused, if the original processor and heat sink are reinstalled together. If either the processor or the heat sink is replaced, use the thermal pad provided in the kit to ensure that thermal conductivity is achieved.



CAUTION: You must position the processor correctly in the processor socket to avoid permanent damage to the processor.


- **1** Ensure that the processor cover is fully open.
- 2 Align the pin-1 corner on the processor with the pin-1 corner on the processor socket and place the processor in the processor socket.
- **3** Align the notches on the processor with the tabs on the processor socket.
- 4 After the processor is fully seated in the socket, close the processor cover while keeping the release lever fully extended.



CAUTION: Ensure that the processor-cover notch is positioned underneath the alignment post.















Flashing the BIOS

You may need to flash (update) the BIOS when an update is available or when you replace the system board. To flash the BIOS:

- 1 Turn on your computer.
- 2 Go to www.dell.com/support.
- 3 Click Product support, enter the Service Tag of your computer, and then click Submit.
 - NOTE: If you do not have the Service Tag, use the auto-detect feature or manually browse for your computer model.
- 4 Click Drivers & downloads → Find it myself.
- **5** Select the operating system installed on your computer.
- 6 Scroll down the page and expand **BIOS**.
- 7 Click **Download** to download the latest version of the BIOS for your computer.
- **8** After the download is complete, navigate to the folder where you saved the BIOS update file.
- **9** Double-click the BIOS update file icon and follow the instructions on the screen.



Diagnostics

Power status light: Indicates the power status.

Solid Amber – The computer is unable to boot to the operating system. This indicates that the power supply or another device in the computer is failing.

Blinking Amber – The computer is unable to boot to the operating system. This indicates that the power supply is normal but another device in the computer is failing or not installed properly.



NOTE: See the light patterns to determine the device that is failing.

Off - Computer is in hibernation or turned off.

The power status light blinks amber along with beep codes indicating failures.

For example, the power status light blinks amber two times followed by a pause, and then blinks white three times followed by a pause. This 3,3 pattern continues until the computer is turned off indicating the Recovery image is not found.

The following table shows different light patterns what they indicate, and the suggested solutions:

Table 3. Diagnostics

Light pattern	Problem description
1	System board: BIOS and ROM failure
2	No memory or RAM detected
3	System board or chipset error
3,3	BIOS Recovery image not found
3,4	BIOS Recovery image found but invalid
4	Memory or RAM failure
5	CMOS battery failure
6	Video card or chip failure
7	CPU failure
8	Display failure



The computer may emit a series of beeps during start-up if the errors or problems cannot be displayed. The repetitive beep codes help the user troubleshoot problems with the computer.

Camera status light: Indicates whether the camera is in use.

- · Solid white Camera is in use.
- · Off Camera is not in use.
