Turning Off Your Computer

- 2. Click Start 🧐 , and then click Shut Down.

The computer turns off after the operating system shutdown process finishes.

 Ensure that the computer and any attached devices are turned off. If your computer and attached devices did not automatically turn off when you shut down your operating system, press and hold the power button for at least 8 to 10 seconds until the computer turns off.

The System Setup options allow you to:


- 1 Change the system configuration information after you add, change or remove any hardware in your laptop.

- 1 View the installed amount of memory or set the type of hard drive installed.

Before you use System Setup, it is recommended that you write down the current System Setup information for future reference.

Entering System Setup

1. Turn on (or restart) your laptop.



 While the laptop is booting, press <F2> immediately before the operating system logo appears to access the BIOS Setup Utility. If an error occurs during POST (Power On Self Test), you may also enter the BIOS Setup Utility by pressing <F2> when prompted.

NOTE: If you wait too long and the operating system logo appears, continue to wait until you see the Microsoft[®] Windows[®] desktop, then shut down your laptop and try again.







Removing the System Board

- 2. Remove any installed card or blank from the 3-in-1 Media Card reader.
- 3. Remove the base cover (see Removing the Base Cover).
- 4. Remove the battery pack (see Removing the Battery Pack).
- 5. Follow the instructions from step 4 to step 6 in Removing the Hard Drive.
- 6. Remove the Mini-Card(s) (see Removing the Mini-Card(s)).
- 7. Remove the memory module(s) (see Removing the Memory Module(s)).
- 8. Remove the hinge cover (see Removing the Hinge Cover).
- 9. Remove the keyboard (see Removing the Keyboard).
- 10. Remove the palm rest assembly (see Removing the Palm Rest Assembly).
- 11. Remove the Bluetooth[®] card (see <u>Removing the Bluetooth Card</u>).
- 12. Remove the coin-cell battery (see Removing the Coin-Cell Battery).
- 13. Remove the display assembly (see Removing the Display Assembly).
- 14. Remove the I/O board (see Removing the I/O Board).
- 15. Remove the four screws that secure the system board to the computer base.



16. Carefully ease the connectors on the system board out of the slots in the computer, and lift the system board off the computer base.

Replacing the System Board

- 1. Follow the instructions in Before You Begin.
- 2. Align the connectors on the system board with the slots on the computer base and place it on the computer base.
- 3. Replace the four screws that secure the system board to the computer base.
- 4. Replace the I/O board (see Replacing the I/O Board).
- 5. Replace the display assembly (see Replacing the Display Assembly).
- 6. Replace the coin-cell battery (see Replacing the Coin-Cell Battery).
- 7. Replace the Bluetooth card (see Replacing the Bluetooth Card).
- 8. Replace the palm rest assembly (see Replacing the Palm Rest Assembly).
- 9. Replace the keyboard (see Replacing the Keyboard).
- 10. Replace the hinge cover (see Replacing the Hinge Cover).
- 11. Replace the memory module(s) (see Replacing the Memory Module(s)).
- 12. Replace the Mini-Card(s) (see <u>Replacing the Mini-Card(s)</u>).
- 13. Follow the instructions from step 6 to step 8 in Replacing the Hard Drive.
- 14. Replace the battery pack (see Replacing the Battery Pack).
- 15. Replace the base cover (see Replacing the Base Cover).
- 16. Replace any cards or blank that you removed from the 3-in-1 Media Card reader.

CAUTION: Before turning on the computer, replace all screws and ensure that no stray screws remain inside the computer. Failure to do so may result in damage to the computer.

17. Turn on the computer.

Entering the Service Tag in the BIOS

- 1. Ensure that the AC adapter is plugged in and that the main battery is installed properly.
- 2. Turn on the computer.
- 3. Press <F2> during POST to enter the system setup program.
- 4. Navigate to the security tab and enter the service tag in the Set Service Tag field.
